

## SCHOOL PERFORMANCE REPORT 2019

## Executive Summary

This Annual School Performance Report provides information about the holistic Performance of schools for the year 2019. The holistic performance assessment considered the three scorecards viz. the academic achievement, the enabling practices and the physical and psycho-social ambiences of schools.

The report presents the lists of schools which appeared in top-10 in four different levels; classes III, VI, X and XII for the academic years 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019. The report also highlights the comparative Academic Learning Scores (ALS) of the nation for the last four years in terms of percentage of students who scored an aggregate of more than or equal to $45 \%, 60 \%$ and $70 \%$ categories in their final assessment scores.

The targets set for each category as per SPMS are $100 \%, 80 \%$ and $40 \%$ for $45 \%, 60 \%$ and $70 \%$ categories respectively. This means that $100 \%$ of students should score more than or equal to $45 \%, 80 \%$ of students should score more than or equal to $60 \%$ and $40 \%$ of students should score $70 \%$ and above in their final assessment scores. The ALS report shows that class III students have achieved the targets under 60\% and 70\% categories, while class VI students have achieved the target under the category of $70 \%$. However, classes X and XII have not achieved the target for all the three categories.

The main part of the report provides comparative ALS of each Dzongkhag and Thromde for the past four years. This report gives avenue for the 20 Dzongkhags and 4 Thromdes to conduct diagnostic study on the academic performance of students in their Dzongkhags/ Thromdes and initiate appropriate interventions to improve the performance.

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## Introduction

The information and data presented in the report are drawn from the School Performance Management System (SPMS) 2019. SPMS is a system instituted in 2010 to provide schools and Dzongkhags with the tools to manage their own performance. In addition, this system informs stakeholders on the overall performance of schools based on three key scorecards, namely, Academic Learning Score (ALS), Enabling Practices Score (EPS), and Gross National Happiness (GNH). These three scorecards cover all the aspects of school practices.

The performances of schools are assessed holistically based on the three elements of School Performance Management System (SPMS). They are School Self-Assessment (SSA), School Improvement Plan (SIP) and School Performance Scorecards. School Performance scorecards consist of Academic Learning Scorecards (ALS), Enabling Practices Scorecard (EPS) and Gross National Happiness Scorecard (GNH), which includes physical and psycho-social components.

SSA is a tool, used by schools to reflect and assess their performance in a systematic and comprehensive manner. It takes into account the functioning of school leadership and management, students' learning outcome, students and teachers' engagement and their wellbeing. This is done at the start of the year and reviewed in the middle of the academic year.

SIP is a tool used by schools to prepare an improvement plan by setting targets for the academic year and developing action plan to achieve the desired improvements based on SSA. This is developed at the beginning of the year and reviewed towards the end of the year. SIP is endorsed by Dzongkhag Education Officers (DEOs) and Thromde Education Officers (TEOs) during the first round school visits. DEOs/TEOs validate the achievement and ratings of schools using EPS \& GNH Scorecards during the secondround visit. The final agreed ratings are submitted through online to EMD.

While EPS and GNH aspects are rated through physical observations by DEOs/TEOs during the year, ALS is reported at the end of the year. ALS is the outcome of the yearend academic performance of students, which is based on BCSEA examination results

## of Classes X and XII, and school's assessments for classes III and VI.

The details of the report are as under:

- Overall performance of Dzongkhag/Thromde based on three Scorecards;
- Top 10 schools for the year 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 at classes III, VI, X and XII levels;
- National level comparative analysis of ALS in different categories at four levels for 2016, 2017, 2018 \& 2019; and
- Comparative analysis of ALS of Dzongkhags/Thromdes for the past four years.

The result of School Performance for 2019 was declared on 3rd April 2020 after endorsement of top ten schools by HRC on 17th March 2020. The top 10 schools in four class levels (III, VI, X \& XII) were recognised with certificates and cash prizes. Cash prizes and certificates were also awarded to the schools that made significant improvement in their overall weighted scores.

## ALS Analysis of the Nation for the past 4 years

The Ministry of Education introduced the School Performance Management System in 2010 with the following Academic Learning Scores (ALS) targets:

- $100 \%$ of the students in classes III, VI, X and XII should score more than or equal to $45 \%$ in their final assessment;
- $80 \%$ of the students in those classes should score more than or equal to $60 \%$;
- $40 \%$ of the students should score more than or equal to $70 \%$.

The overall academic performance of class III in 2019 has improved from that of previous years. There is significant improvement in 2019 with $90.6 \%$ of students scoring in 60\% and above category. Students have also achieved the targets of 60\% and 70\% categories.

## ALS analysis of Dzongkhag/Thromde, 2019

## Bumthang Dzongkhag

Ministry of Education (MoE) measures the academic learning score of schools using School Performance Management System (SPMS) as the tool. As per SPMS, the performance is measured based on three categories of students:

Category 1: Percentage of students scoring an aggregate of more than or equal to 45\%,
Category 2: Percentage of students scoring more than or equal to 60\%, and
Category 3: Percentage of students scoring more than or equal to $70 \%$ in their annual consolidated result.

The performance of students is considered to be good or otherwise based on the percentage of students scoring $60 \%$ and above since $60 \%$ is considered the 1st Division marks. The cut off marks for higher studies is also around $60 \%$ while the percentage required for selection to job market also is on average $60 \%$.

The following tables and figures show the performance of the students in the Dzongkhag for the past four years.
